in 1999, teamed up with Orlando contractor Farina & Sons to correct past mistakes and add modern conveniences and energy-efficient features while maintaining the home's historic integrity. The project added 1,255 square feet as well as a three-car garage with a breezeway. The sunroom was expanded—and the leak fixed—and a master suite was created. Also new is a family room addition, bathrooms and a kitchen with walnut cabinets that feature a beautiful distressed finish.
